London's Sewage.

The Toronto Globe a.vs.: "Action has been taken in one of the courts against the city of London because of its practice of putting its sewage into the River Thames. The Free Press complains that the city is being "pursued" and "singled out for persecution" by the Attorney-General. This is not putting the case fairly. The matte got into the courts by the setion, not of the Attorney-General, but or the inhabitant of neighboring municipalities, who complained that they were injured by the pollution of the rives by the cit, of London. By reason of these complaints and in obedience to the law, the Brownie alborate report, in which they not only condemned the existing system of drainage, but made various suggetions for its improvement. Since that time several suits have been brought against the city of London to compel them to case the pollution of the stream. These proceedings were begun first by the corporation of London West and more recently by Mr. Chapman, who, we believe, represent some of the inhabitants of that place. It is true that these proceedings, being of a quasi-criminal character, are carried as in the name of the Attorney-General, but the Attorney-General having been applied to and having before him the report of the Provincial Board of Health, would fail in his duty unless he allowed his name to be used. In the last case he again asked the opinion of the secretary of the Board of Health, and was informed that the city had not yet taken the proper steps to abate the nuisance; in a ser words, that there is the same justification for an action now as there was in 1885. There is no discrimination against the city of London. The Free Press says that Woodstock, Ingersol, St. Marys and other places use the river for drainage purposes and yet are not prosecuted. If any citizen or corporation chose to take these towns into the courts and the circumstances were found to be the same, the Attorney-General would be bound to lend his name to th
