VESSEL OVERTURNED!

Awful Disaster in a Storm on Lake Michigan.

The Vessel's Crew of Six Men Drowned The Captain and His Two Danghters Also Go Down.

Manistree, Mich., Aug. 31.—The schooner City of Toledo, belonging to the Manistee Lumber Company, cleared from this port yesterday noon with a cargo of lumber. She was caught in the nerthwestern and driven on the beach at Pierport, eighteen miles north of here, about 6 o'clock. She turned completely over in a few minutes, and all hands on board were lost.

She was commanded by Capt. John Mc-Millan, of this city. He had his two eldest daughters on beard with him. The balance of the crew consisted of six men, none of whom live in this city. Efforts to learn their names have thus far been unsuccessful. The boat is rated Bl, and was valued at \$4,500. The cargo was valued at about \$2,000; no insurance.

There was a heavy sea when the boat went out, so much so that the crew had to take to the rigging. Three hours afterward she was sighted with her flag at hair wast, making for the beach. The vessel now lies bottom up about 50 rods north of Pierport.
