SHAMROCKS SMOKE UP WARREN LAMPS 21-15

Irish Girls Drew Away in Last Period After Surging Struggle.

SEVERAL INJURIES

"Sparkie" Dakin, Invading Star, Has To Retire in Last Half.

Well, they went and did it. London Shamrocks attained their revenge for the beating they received in Warren last February by wallowing their former victors, the Warren Lamps, 21 to 15 in the last international match of the season, in the armories Saturday night.

It was one of those struggles where you see one team leading, and then the other, all the way through—a mix, that keeps the crowd on its feet all the time and holding its breath on each play. To say the least it was the best struggle put up by any two teams this season, and was featured by close checking along with some very intricate plays and pretty combinations.

The Warren team was all that it was supposed to be—a fast and tricky quintet that had the locals on the bit all the way. The visitors started things and led alternately through the first half, but the Shamrocks came through in the final period strong and left the Warren girls in the lurch. The Lamps felt the loss greatly of their star defence "Sparkie" Dakin, who had to be carried from the game in the fourth quarter, after a collision with the local defence. The mix was just a series of bumps for the diminutive Warren guard, who found it hard going against the bigger and heavier London girls. In spite of their size, however, she managed to put Lottie Garrett out for a few minutes with an injured nose. "Sparkie" is a player who has speed and a good shot. She supplied the punch for the team.

Fireworks Start.

The fireworks went off with a bang for the Lamps, when Marie Gouldthorpe got a long counter from centre floor, just after missing one from about the same position. Lottie Garrett made up for it, however, coming from inside on a pass to Isabel Duncan, and then put the home team ahead with another one from right under the cage. "Petie" Stein evened it up again in another long shot from the side lines. The tight Shamrock defence forced the Lamps to do their shooting from outside. This kind of shooting seemed to be getting results, for Marg Foley put the visitors ahead with another shot of this species. Quarter time—Warren—London.

To start this period, the locals made a change. Marion Hayden going on for Isabel Duncan. Mary Lindsay came in from defence to nab the rebound off "Petie" Stein shot for another counter, tying things up again. Time off. Somebody disrespectfully sneaked up on Pearl Blackwell and poked her in the eye—the result, many tears and Pearl unable to see for a few seconds—Lottie Garrett avenged the injury to her teammate by scoring, when nobody was looking, on a pass from Mary Clark. Both teams began to pull off a bit of holding that made the play close. "Sparkie" got rough with her big adversaries and gave Lottie Garrett a point on a free shot. Shamrocks called time. Both teams used some pretty combination plays with no result as the half ended. Score—Warrens 12, London 15.

Collens Get Lead.

This was the period that the locals obtained their lead. Lottie Garrett did the trick, scoring three times successively, at the end of fast combinations. "Petie" Stein made things look brighter for the Lamps when she broke away for a counter from the side lines. Here Lottie Garrett collided with "Sparkie" and was forced to leave the game. Marg Turner took her place. A few passes later "Sparkie" herself had to be carried from the floor with an injured limb, as a result of another collision with Marg Turner. The girls who were tried hard to stay in the mix, but she was unable to stand on her injured foot. Lottie Garrett replaced her, and Marg Foley came in from under the basket, fooling her guard each time. Isabel Duncan went on for Pearl Blackwell and took the play in the Warren territory as the period ended. Score—Warrens 12, London 15.
