

Local Rugby Committee To Offer Amends To Petrolia Club

Rugby Committee Suggests Either Game or 'Reparations' For Petrolia Grid Club

Will Also Forward Letter of Apology to Hard Oil Officials.

Every amends possible will be made to the Petrolia Rugby Club by the local Rugby committee as a result of the Thanksgiving Day fiasco, when a London team failed to show up in the Hard Oil center for a scheduled fixture.

The Rugby committee will offer Petrolia another game, or, failing that, will make up the gate the Hard Oil lost by the non-appearance of the London team. In either case a letter of apology will be sent to Petrolia officials.

Petrolia has not made any threats of asking the O. R. F. U. for London's suspension. The Hard Oil has taken the matter in a sporting way, and apparently this attitude has but deepened the repentance noticeable in local circles.

"I'm very sorry this should have happened, just when it was thought that Rugby had been placed on a solid footing in London once more," said President F. J. O'Connell, who is here on a trip. "Someone certainly bungled. Members of the committee are willing to make any amends possible to the Petrolia club, and something will be done immediately."

Mr. O'Connell felt the matter keenly because of the reflection it might cause on the L. A. A. A.

It is believed that Petrolia will accept another game rather than accept "reparations." Unfortunately there won't be another Thanksgiving Day for the game—a day always set aside in the ex-Oil Town for Rugby.
