

Caught in the Snow

Extraordinary Scenes Among the Doukhobors on Their March East.

Pitiable Condition of Fanatics Who Have Insufficient Food and Covering.

People in Settlements Along the Way Keep Them From Starving.

Winnipeg, Nov. 4.—(Special)—The Doukhobors' camp was a scene of aching misery at a little after seven this morning. The shivering pilgrims were huddled together in a vain effort to keep warm.

With cold winds blowing from the north, hundreds had lain on the ground all night and a heavy snow had fallen. The Doukhobors were in a pitiable condition. Jesus had put it into the hearts of people near Foxwarren, one of whom told me, to have their grain threshed, and thus provide a resting place in the straw stacks for the seekers after the new light. At Foxwarren the Doukhobors were seen to be singing an hour, singing chants and talking to the few villagers who went out in the cold. They told me that one Doukhobor that he did not love Jesus or he would march to find Him with them, saying it more in sorrow than in anger.

Rev. C. Jeffrey, secretary of the Church of England Missions, returned here today from a tour of inspection which he endeavored to reason with the Doukhobors and urge them to return to their farms, but words had no effect. They insisted that they were following Jesus and following His commandments by forsaking all that they had.

A STRANGE SPECTACLE.—Winnipeg, Nov. 4.—The Free Press has the following this morning from its special correspondent with the Doukhobor army.

Foxwarren, Nov. 3.—A new factor has entered into the Doukhobor pilgrimage. Nature, which, since the commencement of the pilgrimage, has smiled on the fanatics, has now changed her mood. Many times the searchers for the Son of God have asserted that he would give them sunny skies under which to travel during the next two months. There would be no winter, they said, while they were on the march. The sun would shine every day, and the weather would be just what they needed during the preliminary visits made from one Doukhobor community to another. It was a promise that had been on the side of the pilgrims. Tonight a perfect morning, but a perfect storm was brewing. Heavy clouds banked in from the west. The wind grew hourly more bitter and keen, and by 5 o'clock there was a blizzard. At 6 o'clock the earth lay white under three inches of snow. The Doukhobors hurriedly than ever as I send this dispatch, and gives every indication of continuing to travel. The Doukhobors are all their predictions—and the great discomfort which the pilgrims must have. Especially is disappointment felt among the friends of imperial unity at Canada's attitude. It is now discovered that the Canadian government is the entire initiative on every subject to British, Australian, New Zealand and South African ministers. Natives of Hebrides Engaged in Warfare—Villages are Raided.

Steamer Mowat, which reached port yesterday from Australia and south seas ports, brings advices from the New Hebrides of tribal wars, several villages having been plundered and burned by natives during tribal-fighting on Espiritu Santo island. The natives immediately upon the outbreak of the war, fled to an inland tribe, which is very numerous and powerful. The chief of the hill tribe, Nandau, had previously fled attacking parties along the coast, vowed to kill all those falling within his net.
