

When the lon-ents are well grown the plants in the pots are to be kept in a dry condition; or, if the plants are in the open ground, then they should be partially pulled up, so as to loosen the fine-roots, and then be pressed back by stepping on the soil above the roots; this will check the growth and prevent the seeds from getting perfectly ripe.
