BROOKE COUNCIL

Inwood, June 13th, 1925
Council met pursuant to adjournment. Members all present. Minutes of former meeting read and on motion of Johnston-McVicar were adopted.

Report of Geo. A. McCubbin, O.L.S., read varying the proportion of assessment on 6-7 sideroad drain, by adding to the assessment the east half of lot seven and the north thirty acres of the west half of lot eight in the third concession, the assessment for benefit \$50.00 and outlet \$15.00. Expenses in connection are engineers fees \$5.00 and clerk's fees \$5.00.

Wilcox—Wallis, that report be adopted and Clerk notify owners of above lots to pay to Township the amounts of their assessments, the same less the expenses to be pro rata over lands and roads assessed under bylaw No. 24 of 1922 and drainage assessments be reduced on 1925 Collectors Roll.—Carried.

Notice to have the dam removed on the Weidman drain at the 8-9 concession was received from J. F. McNally, Peter Campbell and Neil Munro. Filed.

Wallis—McVicar, that Council open as a Court of Revision on Assessment Roll, revise in the chair.—Carried.

Strike off Wm Rundle, Lawson Run-

dle, e hf lot 27, con. 9; Duncan Campbell, lot 28 con. 4; Wm. Leitch n w qr 16, con. 3.

Johnston—Wilcox, that changes as made be confirmed and court closed. Carried.

Report of A. S. Code, O.L.S., read on the proposed repairs to the Zavitz-Campbell drain estimated cost \$548. Johnston—Wallis, that report be adopted and bylaw be prepared authorizing work and loan.—Carried.

Bylaw submitted and read authorizing repairs to the Zavitz-Campbell drain on lots 13-14 con. 3, and to borrow on the credit of the Municipality the sum of \$548.00 for completing same.

Wallis—Wilcox, that bylaw be provisionally adopted, printed in pamphlet form, with a copy served on each ratepayer assessed, with a Court of Revision to be held in Code's Hall, Alvinston, on Saturday, the 18th day of July, 1925 to open at 2.00 p.m. Nevil McVicar to be commissioner and to serve bylaws.—Carried.

Bylaw submitted and read authorizing the Reeve and Clerk to sign the agreement with the Hydro Electric Power Commission of Ontario, to supply power in accordance with the Rural Hydro Distribution Act of 1921.

Johnston—Wallis, that bylaw be read a third time and finally passed.—Carried.

Mr. Jas. H. Johnston, commissioner in charge of the repairs to the Weidman drain, reported the work completed. Receipts \$879.20; Expenditures \$851.50; balance to the credit of the drain \$27.70.

Wallis, that report be adopted and balance be left to the credit of the drain.—Carried.

Mr. John Turner, owner of w hf lot 3, con. 2, served notice in writing to have the Hazen drain repaired.

Wallis—Wilcox, that notice be entertained and Geo. A. McCubbin, O.L.S., be instructed to make an

examination and submit a report, plan, profile and estimate and to make an assessment of lands and roads liable, whether such assessment be a variation from former assessment or not but in accordance with the Municipal Drainage Act.—Carried.
