Stucco Whitereash — The following receipt for making a beautiful Stucco Whitewash, we recommend to the attention of our readtural portion of them. It is taken from the Genesee Farmer.

Take clean lumps of well burnt lime, (say five or six quarts,) slack the same with hot water in a tub, (covered, to keep in the steam) pass it in the fluid form through a fine sieve, add one fourth of a pound of whiting or burnt alum, pulverized; one pound of good sugar; nts of rice flour, made into a thin and well boiled paste, and one pound of clean glue, dissolved by first soaking it well, and then putting it into a small kettle, which should again be put into a larger one filled with water, and placed over a slow fire.
