Rural parts were his forte, even before he carried on the Uncle Josh role, and it will be because he was a master in such parts that the theatregoing pubic will most sorely miss him.

"Billie" Boehner was a native of Annapolis Royal, and had played in all the leading towns throughout the Maritime Provinces and many parts of Canada, as well as all over the United States and Newfoundland. The remains were brought to Annapolis Royal for interment, the funeral taking place with full Masonic honors.


"If the man who leads us doesn't set the example to you men and women as well as to the countless numbers who never enter a church's portals, God help the United States."
