## THE OTTAWA YALLEY.

(Correapondence of the Camada Luminatifan.)
The one absorbing and prevailing topic in lumber circles is the scarcity of men, and it is not all talk either, for lack of holp is proving a serious business in the yards and on the limits $\mathbf{t 0 0}$. The late harvest in Quebec and Ontario and the prevailing high rate of wages drew the men to the fields and the are not available for the limity and mill yards. Ot course, -mk.iers will improve as soun as the harvest work is nearing a close. Railway agells and mill men say that large quantities of lumber are lying in the jards awaiting shipment, but tied up for the reason that men cannot be secured to load it. One dealer this week offered tliree dollars a day, but could not get men to load $x$ rush order. It is a bir jump from eight or nine dollars a week in a mill yard to thirty dollary a month and board on a farm, and the unskilled taborer ataturally prefers the latter.
For a similar reason, as has been remarked before, it is difficult to get men for work on the limits. The Georgian liay firms are offering in Ottawa as high as thirty-five dollars $a$ month and boatd for axe men. Local firms naturally do not welcome this intrusion, as it meais incressed autlay lor them. Men are being forwarded almost daily from Ollawa, Thurso, Ruckingham and other points to the Georginn Bay and Soo country. A firm operating near the Soo is said to have
gone an far in its search for men as to lave secured the releast of six pizomers from the County jail. The aggregate nmount of the fines, $\$ 50$, will be deducted from the men's wage. in the woxis.
Many inexperienced men are finding their way to the lumber currps. Grue. some proof in given by the recordy of the local hospilaly. Almost every day for the past fortnight, disubled novices al the logmaking business have been broughit down, a frot or a hand having been choppest instead of a tree. To-day there were four such cases. Yesterday a local lumberman rejected five of eight men offered for work in the woods.
Already calculations are being made on the quolations on next year's cut of deals. It is safe 10 say there will be an advance of from five to ten per cent., made neces. sary, so the operators say, by the advance in wages and the inferior class of labor offering. What will have to be taken as a good day's work this year would not have been accer.ed a few years ago.
Fraser \& Company's new mill at Descheney, above Oltawa, will be running full blast in a few days. The firm figures on culling about five million feet of lumber this seayon.
