Ontario Rifle Association.

The eighteenth annual prize meeting of the Ontario Rifle Association, held at Toronto, commenced Monday, 25th August. In the morning rain threatened, but it fortunately held off. The entries were about the same in number as last year. The firing tickets were all timed, and when presented at the proper butt were targetted by the range officers, this arrangement working very well. The whole management of the meeting was exemplary, and the competitors noted with pleasure the absence of causes of annoyance felt at previous meetings. There was, however, one substantial grievance on this occasion, this being the excessive charge for extra series tickets, a charge warranted neither by the trouble involved nor by the prize lists. As these extra competitions are not fired on targets continuously set apart for the purpose, but only on the regular match targets prior to the opening of the regular matches, their main use is for "sighting shots," and as such they are altogether too costly.

The forenoon of Monday was given to extra series, when all who wished got their elevations for the regular matches. At 1 p.m. the regular matches were commenced and the "maidens" entertained themselves for an hour in the Canada Company match, 200 and 400 yards, five shots.
