

- Despite the unexpected increase, the carry over from 1989 to 1990 is reported to have been much smaller than that from 1988 to 1989, thus reducing the total supply for 1990.
- Reflecting the total supply situation in 1990, the prices in January and February 1991 were higher than those for previous years.

Market Situation and Outlook

- While Canadian exports of redfish to Japan decreased in 1990 by more than 50% from 1989 due to poor landings, total imports increased by 5% due to unexpectedly greater quantities imported from the US for the United States DAF.
