The following members of the Department of External Affairs are now on their way or will be leaving in a few days for Indochina to take up their appointment with the International Supervisory Commissions:

- Marcel Cadieux of Montreal who will be Political Adviser to the Canadian Commissioner in Vietnam;
- R. Duder of St. John's, Newfoundland, who will be Political Adviser to the Canadian Commissioner in Cambodia;
- J. H. Thurrott of Fredericton, N.B., who will be Political Adviser to the Canadian Commissioner in Laos;
- A. R. Kilgour, of Toronto, who will be Deputy Secretary-General of the Commission Secretariat in Vietnam;
- A. R. Crepault of Montreal and R. W. Murray of Woodstock, Ontario, and Toronto, who will be on the staff of the Canadian Commissioner in Vietnam.

Mr. Duder and Mr. Thurrott will serve as Acting Commissioners in Cambodia and Laos respectively pending the arrival in the near future of the Commissioners. Mr. Duder is proceeding to Indochina from Belgrade where he has been First Secretary in the Canadian Embassy. Mr. Thurrott is proceeding from Colombo where he has been First Secretary in the Office of the High Commissioner for Canada to Ceylon. Mr. Cadieux returned recently from Paris where he was Counsellor at the Canadian Permanent Delegation to the North Atlantic Council. Messrs. Kilgour, Crepault and Murray were at the time of their appointment in the Department of External Affairs in Ottawa.
