

printing quality and so on. Canadian publishing houses will be entering some 50 books from among this country's best.

The Festival programme will also include concerts, lectures on literary matters and conferences in which personalities from the literary world and the Canadian publishing industry will be taking part. A Canadian delegation will travel to Nice for the occasion. Among its members will be the National Librarian of Canada, Mr. Guy Sylvestre, the Associate Director of the Canada Council, Mr. Peter Dwyer, and his assistant, Mr. Naim Kattan, Mr. Jacques Hébert, President of the Association des Editeurs Canadiens-français, Mr. Marsh Jeanneret, President of the Canadian Book Publishers' Council, Mr. J. Z. Léon Patenaude, Secretary-General of the Conseil Supérieur du Livre, and Mr. Henk Hoppner, Secretary of the Canadian Book Publishers' Council.

This venture is a part of the Canadian Government's effort to ensure greater international recognition for Canadian works published in French and English.

This policy has already lead to regular representation for Canadian books at such important international events as the international book fairs in Frankfurt and Brussels, the annual convention of the American Library Association and various major exhibitions in other countries.
