CANADIAN ATTITUDE TOWARD ADMISSION OF MAINLAND CHINA

Mr. T. C. Douglas (Burnaby-Coquitlam): Mr. Speaker, my question is for the right hon. Prime Minister. In view of his message to the world veterans federation urging that there be universal membership for the United Nations, I should like to ask the Prime Minister whether this means that the Canadian government will instruct its delegation to the United Nations to support the admission of mainland China.

Right Hon. L. B. Pearson (Prime Minister): Mr. Speaker, it always has been the position of the Canadian government that the membership of the United Nations should be universal, and that there are disputes, and will be disputes, in the world which cannot be resolved or even assisted by the United this ideal soon will be realized, but there are not members of the United Nations. We hope this ideal soon will be realized, but there are certain conditions which have to be fulfilled before the membership of any particular country can be approved in the United Nations. I am thinking now of the government at Peking, and I understand discussions are going on at the moment with a view to that matter being considered at the next meeting of the assembly. I cannot add anything other than that statement.
