FEDERAL GRANTS FOR SOCIAL DEVELOPMENT OF NORTHWESTERN QUEBEC

Question No. 908-Mr. Caouette:

- 1. Does the government make any grants to the Council for the Social Development of Northwestern Quebec and, if so, what total amount has been given to this organization?
- 2. Who are the members of this organization?
- 3. Is a federal public servant a member of this organization and, if so (a) what is his name (b) what are his duties (c) what is his salary (d) since when has he been performing these duties?

Hon. John Munro (Minister of National Health and Welfare): 1. The federal government has recently approved a grant under the National Welfare Grants program for a demonstration project to the Conseil de Développement Social du Nord-Ouest Québecois Incorporated. The grant for the current fiscal year is \$22,265. The first phase of the project will last eighteen months and it is anticipated the total financial requirement will be approximately \$100,000. The actual amounts will depend on budgetary needs.

- 2. The members of this organization are agencies involved in the health and welfare field in the Northwest region of Quebec and interested individuals. This Department does not have a list of the membership of this organization.

MIGRATORY BIRDS CONVENTION ACT—INDIAN HUNTING FOR FOOD ON RESERVES

Question No. 912-Mr. Fairweather:

- 1. Will an announcement be made that no Indian hunting for food on a Reserve or unoccupied Crown Land shall be prosecuted under the provisions of the Migratory Birds Convention Act and, if so, on what date?
- 2. Will discussions be held between representatives of the Indian people and the Government of Canada with the objective of preparing an amendment to the Migratory Birds Convention Act and, if so, on what date?
- 3. During the National Conference on the Indian Act April 28-May 2, 1969, did the Minister of Indian Affairs and Northern Development promise to "make known the views of the gov-
