Mr. Chrétien: Since we are close to five o'clock, Mr. Speaker, I will not raise any more issues. One of the accusations made by the Leader of the Opposition was that we are not following the Alaskan experience. I was in Alaska before he was and officials of my department visit Alaska regularly. They are making sure that we are kept informed on everything taking place there. I can assure hon. members that we pretty well know the situation in Alaska, and know much more about the situation in the north than do the members of the opposition. We will have ample opportunity to discuss the bill in committee after second reading. I am willing to examine all suggestions made by hon. members in committee, and I am sure this bill is going to be a great improvement on the former legislation governing the administration of the resources in the north.
