PRAYERS.

On motion of Mr. Diefenbaker, seconded by Mr. Pearson, it was ordered,—That the Speech of His Excellency, The Right Honourable Georges Philias Vanier, D.S.O., M.C., Governor-General of Canada, together with the address of welcome made by the Prime Minister in the Senate Chamber on January 14, 1960, be printed as an Appendix to the Official Report of Debates in the House of Commons and form part of the permanent record of this Parliament.
