The said Bill was then read a third time accordingly. The question was put whether this Bill shall pass?

It was resolved in the affirmative.

Ordered, That the Clerk do go down to the House of Commons, and acquaint that House that the Senate have passed this Bill without any amendment.

Pursuant to the Order of the Day, the Bill intituled: "An Act respecting the "Canadian Pacific Railway Company," was read a third time.

The question was put whether this Bill shall pass?

It was resolved in the affirmative.

Ordered, That the Clerk do go down to the House of Commons, and acquaint that House that the Senate have passed this Bill without any amendment.

The House, according to Order, was adjourned during pleasure, and again put into a Committee of the Whole on the Bill intituled: "An Act consolidating and amend-"ing the several Acts relating to the Militia and Defence of the Dominion of Canada."

(In the Committee.)

The Sixty-fourth clause read.

It was moved to agree to the same.

In amendment it was moved,

That the said clause be amended as follows:-

Page 23, line 11.—After "corps" insert "at any time, or while in the uniform of his corps."

After Debate, it was

Ordered, That further consideration of the said clause be postponed. The Sixty fifth to the One hundredth clause, inclusive, read and agreed to. Schedule read and agreed to.

After some time the House was resumed, and

The Honorable Mr. Almon, from the said Committee, reported that they had taken the Bill into consideration, made some progress therein, and had directed him to ask leave to sit again.

Then, on motion of the Honorable Sir Alexander Campbell, seconded by the

Honorable Mr. Almon, it was

Ordered, That the said Committee have leave to sit again to morrow.

Pursuant to the Order of the Day, the Bill intituled: "An Act relating to Bills "of Exchange and Promissory Notes in the Prevince of Prince Edward Island," was read a second time:

On motion of the Honorable Sir Alexander Campbell, seconded by the Honorable

Mr. Smith, it was Ordered, That the said Bill be committed to a Committee of the Whole House to-morrow.

Pursuant to the Order of the Day, the Bill intituled: "An Act to amend "The Dominion Elections Act, 1874" was read a second time.

On motion of the Honorable Sir Alexander Campbell, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Smith, it was

Ordered, That the said Bill be read a third time to-morrow.

Pursuant to the Order of the Day, the Bill intituled: An Act to amend "An Act "respecting the offices of Receiver-General and Minister of Public Works, as to "the powers of the Minister of Railways and Canals" was read a second time.

On motion of the Honorable Sir Alexander Campbell, seconded by the Honorable

Mr. Smith, it was

Ordered, That the said Bill be read a third time to-morrow.
