General Sir Arthur Currie, McGill University, Montreal. October 8th, 1926. June 21st, addressed to Headquarters, M.D. 11, a copy of which letter I enclose herewith for your information. General Ross phoned me after receipt of this letter and said that he thought my letter might be interpreted as encouraging insubordination and of course I explained that that was not my attitude at all. Although I gathered from conversation with General Ross that he would forward my letter to Ottawa I do not know whether it was so forwarded or not, and I have heard absolutely nothing since that time. I understand that the names of these officers are still retained on the Active List although they have not taken any active part in the Regiment and did not attend Camp last summer. I felt it rather keenly after all my efforts that the Regiment, through mismanagement, should have got into such a mess. Yours faithfully, 7. a Robertson FAR /VM
