for instance, with regard to text books -- with District bodies, are they to be subject to the Protestant Committee or the District Boards? I am speaking of outside of Montreal.

DEAN HENDEL: Outside, it seems as if the Protestant Committee work would fill in the interstices of the Board. On the other hand the Protestant Committee is a corporation has such great power that they seem actually to take the power of Government.

DEAN BRITTAIN: Its powers are not sufficiently well defined.

DR. PERCIVAL: That is the way it seems to me, still thinking of the divergencies of which the Principal spoke.

DEAN HENDEL: It is not the powers that are not definded, it is the application of the powers.

DEAN LEMESURIER: I imagine they had in mind the Montreal Metropolitan Commission.

DR. PERCIVAL: The Protestant Committee is going to have the powers of receiving money. It has no taxraising power but it has the power of receiving money.

DEAN O'NEILL: What proportion of the expenses comes out of the Government? As far as I can see the local taxes go to the local Board, and the money is donated
