- 3 the school take together. Courses in the basic sciences, such as chemistry, physiology and bacteriology, are taken with regular students under the Faculty of Arts or the Faculty of Medicine. This eliminates the necessity of providing (with difficulty and at extra expense ) short courses in the above subjects for a few students. Both instructors and students found these courses unsatisfactory. Number of courses studied reduced: The number of courses studied by each group has, therefore, been reduced so that students are now taking five or six full year (or the equivalent in half-year) courses, which conforms to the practice common in other schools or colleges. Grouping and sequence of courses: The grouping under such headings as "Professional Courses in Education" and "Nursing Education" is intended to make clear the purpose of the School, the nature of the curriculum and the sequence and relationship of courses. The purpose is to train not in the art of nursing but in the art of administration or supervision of teaching, and to supply the necessary knowledge of subjects to be taught. Courses in general and professional education are basic and pre-requisite to nursing education. Unity of purpose and basic content: Of great importance is the result already achieved in making all members of the School a more integrated and homogeneous group with a "common denominator" in fundamental knowledge, in aims and objectives in nursing and in an appreciation of the fact that all groups must work together in solving our common professional problems. NEW COURSES 1. Observation and Practice Teaching. 2. Observation and Practice in Clinical Supervision. 3. Observation and Practice in Administration. Systematic graded programmes of instruction in the above fields have been arranged providing for weekly observations, excursions, reports, and supervised practice, accompanied by weekly conferences. 4. Health Education - theory, demonstration, practice, weekly conferences relating to health teaching in the community. 5. Supervision and Organisation of Public Health Nursing. 6. Weekly conferences relating to excursions and field work in public Health Nursing.
