

tence requiring such resignation should at any time be passed upon me, after due examination had, by the tribunal acknowledged or appointed by the Synod of the said Diocese for the trial of a Bishop; saving all rights of appeal allowed by the said Synod."

7. The above declaration in writing, signed by the Bishop elect, or a certified copy thereof, shall be filed with the Secretary of the Synod.

10. The said declaration, or a certified copy thereof, shall be forthwith filed with the Secretary of the Synod.

11. The Bishop Coadjutor shall perform such Diocesan duties, and exercise such Episcopal functions, as the Bishop may assign him; or, in case of mental incapacity of the Bishop, such duties and functions as the Bishop himself might have exercised but for such incapacity.

12. Should any difference arise between the Bishop and his Coadjutor relative to their respective rights and duties, it shall be referred to, and decided by, the House of Bishops of the Province of Canada.

13. The Bishop Coadjutor, when duly consecrated, shall have the right of succession to the See of Fredericton, and shall succeed to the same immediately upon its becoming vacant, and shall be installed as such according to the Canons of the Province of Canada.

14. The Bishop Coadjutor shall have a seat in the Diocesan Synod, and the same right of voting therein as any Priest of the Diocese sitting in such Synod.
