

ing a pass entitling him, so long as he continues to hold such office or position, and when travelling on public business or in the exercise of his public functions, to carriage, free of charge, between all stations on the railway of such company, for himself by first class carriage, and for such quantity of luggage as by the rules of such company is allowed to first class passengers.

Passes for a Province.

**3.** If application in writing is made therefor to any railway company by any of the following persons:—

(a.) Members of the Legislative Councils or of the Legislative Assemblies of the several Provinces of Canada;

To whom to be issued.

(b.) Members of the Council of the North-West Territories of Canada;

(c.) The Chief Justices and Judges of all courts of superior, civil or criminal jurisdiction in the several Provinces or Territories of Canada; the Judges of Vice-Admiralty Courts; the judges of County or District Courts; and judges of Courts of General Sessions of the Peace;

Conditions of issued.

And if the railway of such Company, or any portion thereof, is within the Province or Territory, of the Legislative Council, Legislative Assembly, or Council of which

Conditions of use.

such person is a member, or of any such court of which such person is a judge, such railway company shall issue to the person so applying a pass entitling him to carriage, as provided by section two of this Act, and upon the terms and conditions in said section mentioned, over such railway or portion thereof.

Declaration as to use.

**4.** Every person who receives a pass under the provisions of this Act, shall make a declaration under "*The Act respecting Extra judicial Oaths*," in the form in the schedule to this Act, that such pass is received by and shall be used by him only for such journeys as are necessary to be made by him on public business or in the exercise of his public functions, and shall file such declaration with the Secretary of State of Canada within one month after receipt of such pass.

Rights and obligations of person using a pass under this Act.

**5.** If any person to whom a pass has been furnished under the provisions of this Act is carried or desires to be carried upon any journey for which such pass is furnished, his rights and obligations in all respects of such carriage or desired carriage, shall be those of a first class passenger, who for such journey has paid for the carriage of himself and of such baggage as is allowed as aforesaid.

Penalty for refusing pass.

**6.** Except in the case of the Minister of Railways and Canals, every railway company which refuses to furnish such a pass as is required by this Act to any person entitled to such pass, shall incur a penalty of two hundred dollars for each such offence;
