THE SENATE OF CANADA

BILL G¹⁶.

An Act for the relief of Evelina Dixon Taylor.

Preamble.

WHEREAS Evelina Dixon Taylor, residing at the city of Montreal, in the province of Quebec, cleaner, wife of Aubrey Wendell Taylor, who is domiciled in Canada and residing at the said city, has by her petition alleged that they were married on the twenty-fifth day of September, A.D. 1930, at the said city, she then being Evelina Dixon, a spinster; and whereas by her petition she has prayed that, because of his adultery since then, their marriage be dissolved; and whereas the said marriage and adultery have been proved by evidence adduced and it is expedient that the prayer of her petition be granted: Therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows:—

Marriage dissolved.

1. The said marriage between Evelina Dixon and Aubrey Wendell Taylor, her husband, is hereby dissolved, and shall be henceforth null and void to all intents and purposes whatsoever.

Right to marry again.

2. The said Evelina Dixon may at any time hereafter marry any man whom she might lawfully marry if the said marriage with the said Aubrey Wendell Taylor had not been solemnized.
