leave her; they then sent three Boats with 40 Men to break her up and plunder her; but before her People quitted her, they left a lighted Match in the Gun Room, which soon after blew up the Poop, and 30 of the Enemy upon it; the rest were made Prisoners, and the Schooner taken by the Boats of the Machault and Chezine.

At Eleven at Night, got under sail with the Fleet at St. Michael and passed by the Town of Quebec at Midnight, the English Garrison saluting us as we passed with about 200 or 300 Cannon Shot, and 100 Shells, but without doing any Execution. Proceeded down the River, and came to an Anchor at St. John's.

The rest of this Fleet continued on their Voyage to Bourdeaux, or to other Ports of France, but the Chezine was intercepted by the Rippen.

The Machault of 24 Guns, was taken the Year following by the Fame, in Chaleurs Bay.
