Some of my readers will recollect upon this occasion, the hiftory of one of the first of the ancient states; /hich, tho' under a popular government, was efteemed the wifeft : till that fatal period ; when, being engaged in a war at home with their only dangerous rival, which was fuperior to them at land, but which they triumphed over every year at fea with a fleet of two hundred fail; they at length, when their riches and naval power were at their greatest heighth, and their enemy's coast lay all open to them, neglected their own war, to go upon a diftant land-war, in fupport of a little remote state, scarce heard of before, and made important only by that alliance. We shall foon, I hope, fee the mistake of perfisting in any fuch impracticable attempts; and fhall not give occasion for posterity to pass the same judgment upon our German war, as the wife Roman did upon the Sicilian : Hic primum opes illius civitatis vieta, comminutæ, depressæque sunt : in boc portu Atbeniensium nobilitatis, imperii, gloriæ naufragium factum, existimatur.
