
"This aggrandizement of the urban at the expense of the rural sections is an effect of protection. The protection accorded by the tariff enables manufacturers of certain classes of agricultural implements to charge Canadian consumers 25 per cent. more than the value of the articles manufactured. The same protective tariff permits an overcharge of 30 to nearly 50 per cent. on the cheaper lines of farm carriages. The average rate of taxation on dutiable goods in 1904 was 27 1-2 per cent., and to that extent, speaking broadly, Canadian manufacturers were enabled to overcharge of numbers are in lighter vein, including Chopin's Berceuse and Scherzo, made by those consumers. turers were enabled to overcharge Canadian consumers on purchases made by those consumers. Farmers do not and cannot secure any compensation in return for all this by any tariff that can be devised. We have to-day a surplus of one hundred and twenty million dollars of farm produce for export; that surplus is continually increasing and so long as these conditions continue, the foreign price must control the home price of farm products. While a protective tariff can and does limit our purchasing power, it cannot and does not enhance the price of articles we have to sell.


