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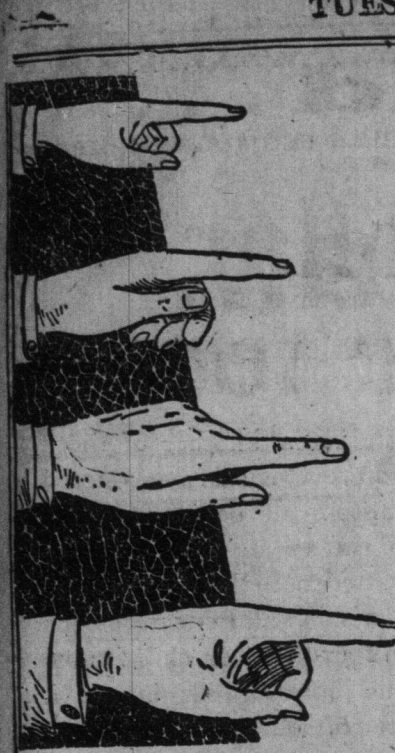

About African Negotiations.

New York, June 20.—Referring to the

settlement of the West African troubles,

the London correspondent of The Tribune says:

"Credit for the West African settlement

is allotted here to Mr. Chamberlain, and

mise. Mr. Chamberlain is popularly re-

garded as the sharpest statesman in public

life, consequently the convention which he

virtually made is accepted as a sensible ar-

rangement for England; if he could not

drive a good bargain, who could? The

points upon which he has insisted all

along have been the French abandonment

of Senegal and all places on the Lower Ni-

ger as far as Senegal. These he has carried.

While the French are excluded from the

negotiable Niger, they are allowed to round

up the convention in an ingenious ex-

ample of give and take negotiations."
