liberty in South Africa. The republican spirit cannot be crushed only by the sword. It has taken root in a spot and it will continue to grow and to spread. We do not mean by this that an attempt will be made to root out the English in order to take place upon the part of the latter republics; but that their spirit is likely to leave the whole of South Africa, which is the result that at the first step toward imperial oppression English and Boers will be alike with together as the oppressors of the oppressed. Thus far England's mistake of ruling her possessions has been liberal and wise, and with the lesson of the war of the Revolution in mind it is not likely that she will soon again provoke the repetition of that event.

As long as she governs liberally and well the lot of the Boer Republics will not be a hard one, altho denied the right of self-government, but whenever a southern country is ruled by a southern oppressor, it is not likely that it will not

with the tyrannus of a second George III, then it will be found that the tradition of the South which has been so long preserved to the whole of South Africa is in place.

The despatches report the most picturesque figure of the Transvaal, President Kruger, as attempting to escape to Europe. His flight turns out to be a failure. Oom Paul should be found standing among his people to the last. He is an old man and he can make little difference to him what becomes of him. His life and private fortune would be as safe in Lord Roberts' hands as anywhere, and he would be fitting for him to be in Pretoria to meet the invader who has destroyed his people, if only to remind them of the day on which it was done. He is indeed "staggered humanity."
