TROTZKY TO PUT TO DEATH ALL WHO ARE TRAITORS TO CAUSE OF THE BOLSHEVIKI

Amsterdam, Aug. 7.-Leon Trotzky, Bolshevik war minister, says a Moscow dispatch by way of Berlin, has issued a proclamation denouncing as traitors, punishable with death, all representatives of the Soviet power who desert their posts before having done everytheir posts before having done every-thing possible for defence. He alludes to the Allied occupation of Archangel and the flight of the local Soviet. Trotzky orders immediate arrest of those members of the Archangel Soviet who can be regarded as deserters, and will put them on trial before a revolu-tionary tribunal.
