He being conscious that he has at last made an improvement that no one has hitherto pretended to, which is Blacking free from oil of vitriol; an ingredient which when used so sparingly, is injurious to leather. The Blacking in general use in Halifax, possesses this ingredient to a great extent and other acids not much less injurious.

The subscriber has frequently observed Prunella foxed boots, the color taken out of the prunella, wherever the Blacking is applied; likewise rosettes and boot laces, and not unfrequently the leather of Ladies' boots and shoes turned entirely black.

This is what induced him to direct his attention to the article, and after much labour and expense, he has been enabled to produce a Blacking free from every ingredient having a tendency to injure leather, whilst it at least possesses all the qualities that other Blackings are said to possess. The durability and facility of polish, may be proved by a moment's trial, and tho' he cannot recommend it as being much cheaper than however sell it as cheap as good Blacking can be imitated. He hopes his friends and the public will at least give him a trial. If such is afforded, he thinks he is not too sanguine in expecting his Blacking will soon supersede the necessity of other Blackings. It is particularly recommended to his customers as a means of preserving the leather.
