The director of the waterworks department of this city would doubtless do well to ponder a little upon the discussion in the city council chamber yesterday.


From certain rumblings up street it would seem that the Star is suffering somewhat from a fit of jealousy.

By refusing to handle press dispatches for Winnipeg newspapers the C. P. Telegraph Co. assumes an attitude which alienates the sympathy of the public. It recalls the story of a passenger going west in the early days who was delayed by a train wreck, and who desired to send a despatch to that effect to waiting friends. The despatch was not sent till all reference to the cause of delay had been eliminated. Today, if people are willing to pay for telegrams they expect to get the service.
