HAVANA, July 23.

FIVE PRATES SHOT.—Yesterday, were shot on the Mole, Francis Dennis alias David, Francis Laores, John de Armas, Juan Romero, natives of Canary Hands; Augustin Loopez alias San Martin, a native of Portugal; and Lorenzo Fernandoz, a native of Portugal; and Lorenzo Fernandoz, a native of Porto Rico; convicted of the crime of piracy by the Marine Court; and the sentence being approved by his Excellency the Governor of this Island.

These are culprits which were published in the Bulletin at the time, as having captured the English brig Vernon, on her voyage from Falmouth, Jamaica, to Halifax—and who murdered Captain Cunningiam and several saliors, plundered the cargo, and burned the vessel.

The sentence was, that the head of David be cut off, and placed on the highest point of Cape Antonio—the scene of the piracy. The heads of the others were to be taken off, and placed in conspicuous places about the harbor of Havana.—Some of the appellate tribunals changed a part of the sentences.

But there are several caps and hats at the City Hall still unclaimed, some of which, however, doubtless belong to persons who effected their escape.

It will be seen by reference to the proceedings of the Common Council, that they met early yesterday morning and directed the necessary steps to be taken for the recovery of any bodies yet remaining in the water, and for the hurial of the dead. In pursuance of their second resolution, they assembled at the City Hall gesterday aftermoon, together with a very large concourse of our citizens, and after an impressive prayer from the Rev. Dr. Wyckoff, followed to the grave the remams of those of the sufferers from this shocking disaster, whose bodies were unclaimed."

DREADEUL N.WS FROM FLORIDA! INDIAN KEY DESTROVED!—The Charleston (S. C.) Courier reports the arrival at that place of the schr. Victoria, Captain Kennon, from Key West, with intelligence that on the night of the 5th inst. the Seminoles landed on Indian Key, and after butchering all the inhabitants who fell into their hands, burnt the whole settlement, consisting of about 30 houses, dwellings and stores.—Buston Merc. MERCHANT SEAMEN.—We understand that a movement is about to be made for having a bill enacted to regulate the qualification of masters and mates of ships in the British merchant service. It is a measure that is much wanted, not only as initimately connected with the commercial interests of the country, but as calculated to save thousands of valuable lives sacrificed every year through the reckless temerity or stupidity, combined in many cases with the ignorance, of the persons who are too often entrusted with the management of merchant vessels. Several of the public journals both here and in England have been recently bringing the subject under notice, and particularly in reference to a bill that has been drafted, containing, among other proposed enactments, clauses for having boards established under the guidance of the Lords of the Admiralty, for examining masters and mates as to their qualifications, &c., and granting them the necessary commissions or certificates.—Scotch paper.
