AQUATIC
To Swim English Channel
Charles B. Darbovic, a Philadelphia bank clerk distance swimmer, is ambitious to swim the English channel. Only two swimmers have accomplished the feat. In 1907 Capt. M. S. Webb, after sixteen attempts, swam from Dover, England, to Cape Gris Nez, France, in 22 hours and 58 minutes, while in 1911, William T. Burgess swam from Dover to Calais in 21 hours and 45 minutes on his second attempt.

HEROIC DEATH DUE TO DISOBEDIENCE
Gunner Bowie, Wounded and Ordered Back, Remained With Doomed Battery

(Montreal Gazette)
It was disobedience to orders that brought about the death in action of Gunner William E. J. Bowie, but it was heroic disobedience, and the story of his death will rank with the gallant deeds that history will tell of the Canadian part in the great war. In the grim battle of St. Eloi, on June 3, Gunner Bowie was with a small battery of guns and things had been going badly with them. The party serving the battery gradually grew less and less. Gunner Bowie was wounded in the chest by a flying splinter and ordered to a rest station, but he gallantly refused to go, and was one of the last three left when they and the guns were blown to pieces by a huge German shell. Gunner Bowie's pocket book, badly charred, was found with bullet holes through it. Few of the individual bodies of the party could be identified.
