TELLS OF SALT CURE FOR TUBERCULOSIS

Sir Leonard Rogers Says Disease Will Disappear Within 25 Years.

New York, Aug. 13. — "Within twenty-five years there will be no more tuberculosis," declared Sir Leonard Rogers, C. I. E. F., one of England's foremost physicians at the International Conference on Tropical Diseases held in Kingston, Jamaica, from July 21 to August 8. Sir Leonard, who has spent most of his life combating diseases in the British colonies, pins his faith to sodium morrhuate, a tubercular remedy which he discovered and subsequently applied with astonishing success.

The remedy, a sodium salt obtained from the codfish, was first used by the English physician in treating leprosy patients in the tropics. His results, however, were even more successful than those of the much lauded castor oil. The doctors noticed, in the case of leprosy, that an intravenous injection of sodium morrhuate destroyed the leprosy bacillus in the body, causing a clearing up of all symptoms.

Because the leprosy bacillus and that of tuberculosis are so similar, both of them being acid fast and highly resistant organisms, Sir Leonard concluded that what would be specific treatment for leprosy might also be specific for tuberculosis. He, therefore, injected into the veins of tubercular victims the codfish preparation, with very favorable results. Sodium morrhuate, it appears, dissolves the heavy capsule of fat which encloses the tubercular bacillus and thus robs it of its protective resiliency.

"The most significant feature of this remedy is the fact that it is so cheap that it lies within the reach of any sufferer," Sir Leonard said at the Kingston meeting. "A few shillings worth of sodium morrhuate will suffice for a thousand patients and there is nothing complicated in the method of its use."

In outlining the treatment to the conference, the physician produced statistics showing that his claims for the remedy were well founded. These showed that in all cases that were hopelessly chronic, improvement was manifested from almost the hour of injection and continued until the patient was cured.

"TRAINING" AN ELEPHANT.
