# TRADE REPORT OF DOMINION

Exports Gain More Rapidly Atl Gulf ...... Than Imports and Restor- Am Int Corp ation of Favorable Balance Am Smelters ... 58% is Nearer.

Ottawa, July 20.—(Canadian Press)

—Value of merchandise exported from Canada in June exceeds the value of imports by \$10,087,892, according to a statement issued yesterday by officials of the Dominion Government. Imports are classed as follows:

Dutiable goods imported \$55,541,608, as compared with \$42,046,205 in June of the preceding year.

This brings the total of goods imported during the month to \$84,582,624 as compared with \$61,668,729 in June of 1922.

Last month \$93,750,837 worth of Canadian produce was exported as compared with \$71,760,563 in June of the preceding year. With foreign produce added the total figures reach \$95,-087,892. In June 1922 the total figure was \$73,107,055.

In the report it is shown that salmon brought \$464,404 during the time covered by the figures; newsprint paper was valued at \$7,006,722; wheat at \$26,463,416 and cheese at \$1,137,650.

In the case of all commodities substantial increases in value were shown

In the case of all commodities substantial increases in value were shown over the figures for the corresponding month last year.

A satisfactory feature of the trade showing is that the increase in exports is much more rapid than that in imports, and that Canada's trade balance is on a fair way to being favorably restored.

Philippines Report Prosperity.

Manila, June 19.—(A. P. by Mail).

—A balance of trade amounting to \$5,839,000 in favor of the Philippine Islands was shown during April, according to figures just issued by the bureau of customs. The total value of the exports during April was \$11,600,000 while the imports were valued at \$5,760,000.

The total foreign commerce of the Philippines during the first three months of 1923 reached \$51,177,000, compared with \$39,813,000 for the first three months of 1923, the exports for the first quarter of 1923 exceeding the imports by \$8,334,000.
