Edmonton, Alta., March 3.—One of
the pioneer missionaries of the west, the

Red River settlement and since had done
missionary work among the Indians and
half-breeds at Isle La Crosse, Beltracchi
Lake and Hecouche. He came to Beltracchi
in 1885 when General Middleton went
there to quell the Riel Rebellion. His
mission was in the line of fire, but he
would not leave his house and was
wounded by a stray bullet.
Some few years ago he retired from
active service and came to Edmonton to
spend his declining years.
