GERMAN STATE TRIBUNAL TO INQUIRY INTO AND FIX

RESPONSIBILITY FOR WAR

RUSSIA READY TO GIVE SPITZBERGEN

Berlin, July 31—(By the Associated Press)—A state tribunal is to inquire into and fix the responsibility for the war. It will be composed of the supreme court of the empire, whose president will be chairman. He will be assisted by the president of the military court and the judges of the Prussian, Bavarian and Hansa high courts. In addition, ten assistant judges will be elected, five by the National Assembly and five by a committee of the German states. The sittings will be public.

The tribunal will be empowered to pronounce only upon the question of guilt: it will not impose punishment.

REPORTS TO SOVEREIGN

LONDON PAPER

STATESMEN SUE

Ottawa, July 31—At yesterday afternoon's session of the Sovereign Grand Orange Lodge reports from various grand officers were received, the most important being that of Wm. Lee of Toronto, grand secretary. During the year thirty-one new primary lodges, two district lodges, and one county lodge were installed. No fewer than 7,907 new members were initiated and 2,151 reinstalled. During the year 2,069 deaths were recorded.

The grand treasurer, Isaac Crawley, reported \$96,343 had been paid to widows and orphans and other beneficiaries; since 1881, \$1,240,000. The reserve fund is \$147,336, and the loss through the war

was \$54,400.

An address of welcome was presented by the five worshipful mistresses of the L. O. B. A. The grand lodge gave them a royal welcome.
