Resolutions By Labor Congress

Refuses to Ask Liberty for Conscientious Objectors—Want Old Age Pensions and Compulsory School Attendance

Quebec, Sept. 22.—The Trades and Labor Congress went on record on Saturday as opposed to petitioning the government to release those sent to prison under the Military Service act who claim that they are conscientious objectors.

At this point Mr. Rees was asked by the chairman to make a presentation to Mr. Watters on behalf of the convention of a souvenir of his seven years' connection with the office of president of the congress. The delegates also allowed Mr. Watters three months' salary and \$800 expense money for his trip to England as fraternal delegate to the British Trades and Labor Congress.

Recommendations adopted dealing with Quebec called for an enquiry into compensation law by the province and the establishment of free and compulsory education, uniform text books to be sold at cost price pending free distribution, free courses in technical education in the government's schools, the enforcement of a law that all workers under twenty-one must be able to read and write either French or English, the appointment of a minister of education, and the fixing of a minimum salary for teachers, who must have a university diploma.

No matter whether the queen is listening to a general at the head of an army corps or to a wounded Tommy in the hospital, the interpolates her correctious auto-

matically when the name of a town is pronounced incorrectly. The following story, says the New York Times, was brought to New York recently by a British staff officer, who said it was related by the Duke of Connaught in the officers' mess at Aldershot.

"The Queen spends much time visiting the wounded men in the hospitals and likes to hear their experiences. There was a sergeant in one of the guard regiments who was severely wounded near Ypres and had received the Victoria Cross for his bravery. The queen heard about him, and on her next visit to the hospital she sat by his bedside and asked him to tell her all the details.

"Well, Your Majesty," he began, "it was just like this. We were at Wipers"—"Wipers?" interrupted the queen—"and got orders to march out and check the advance of the enemy. After we left Wipers—"

"Wipers," said the queen again, and every time he mentioned the name of the old Flemish city she corrected him without it having any effect on the sergeant, who called it "Wipers" every time.

Next day the Duke of Connaught said he had to call at the hospital, and asked the sergeant what he thought of Queen Mary after his long talk with her.

"The Queen is a noble woman, sir," he replied, "but what a pity she hiccoughs so."
