THE INTERCOLONIAL

Speech by Hon. J. W. Donville in the Senate

The following is from the Hansard reports of the Canadian Senate, April 8— DISSOLUTION OF INTERCOLONIAL RAILWAY BOARD OF MANAGEMENT INQUIRY.

Hon. Mr. Donville rose to: Call the attention of the government to the following which appeared in the Gazette newspaper, at April 10, 1913— Moncton, N. B., March 21—M. T. Sidall, defeated Conservative candidate in the last federal election, speaking before the Conservative Club here tonight, declared that the Intercolonial railway board of management was dissolved in a very short time and a new man put in charge of the government railway. He said the board was practically a thing of the past now, and asked—

1. If it is the intention of the government to dissolve the present Railway Commission or Board of Management of the Intercolonial railway and substitute therefor individual management in charge? 2. When will such change of administration take place? 3. What has caused this radical change? 4. Was the management of the commission considered unsatisfactory in part or in whole? Senator Donville said—I think on the present occasion we might give some little attention to the intercolonial railway. I do not propose to travel outside of my rights, but I desire to present the question fairly. Here we have Mr. Sidall, defeated candidate in Westmorland in the last federal election, speaking before the Conservative Club in Moncton, declaring that the Intercolonial Railway Board of Management would be dissolved in a short time, and a new man placed in charge of the railway. He said the board was a thing of the past. What could be the reason for such a statement? If it had come from a Liberal, one might have said there was politics in it, and that it was an attempt to get some disaffection, but here we have the standard bearer of the Conservative party, which, as we all know, is a good majority, boldly making the statement. There must be some reason for his action. I desire to ask who owns the intercolonial railway? Does the government own it, or do the officials of the road? Unfortunately the intercolonial railway has been the receptacle in the past of gentlemen whose services have not been required on other lines. I desire to use the best parliamentary language and I simply put it in that way. If proper remuneration were given to the officials of the road, they would probably have somebody who knew what he was doing, in charge of the road. This is not a complaint against the Conservative party or the Liberal party, but someone or other, the road has got into the hands of people who consider they own it. There was an accident the other day on the line, and there had been two or three accidents previously. Why did they occur? Was it on account of incompetence, bad management or recklessness? Take the town of Rothesay; our mails are thrown off on the 1st of February, and found perhaps on the 15th of March, and

Daily Hints For the Cook

CREAM COOKIES. One cup sugar, 1 cup sour cream, 1 teaspoon soda, flavor as you like, flour to roll. Make as soft as you can handle nicely and do not roll too thin.

LAMBS' KIDNEYS.

Soak, pare and cut in slices six kidneys and sprinkle with salt and pepper. Melt two tablespoons butter in hot frying pan, put in kidneys and cook five minutes; dredge thoroughly with flour and add two-thirds cup boiling water or hot brown-stock. Cook five minutes, add more salt and pepper if needed. Lemon juice, onion juice or madeira wine may be used for additional flavor. Kidneys must be cooked a short time, or for several hours; they are tender after a few minutes' cooking, but soon toughen and need hours of cooking to again make them tender.
