Krupps Win the Case. Philadelphia, Oct. 12—Judge Joseph Buffington, in the U. S. circuit court of appeals, late yesterday handed down a decision dismissing the four suits brought by the Krupp Company of Germany, against the Mitalve Steel Company of Philadelphia, for alleged infringement of patents in the manufacture of armor plate, because not sufficient evidence was presented to show infringement. The decision sustains the lower court.

La MARQUISE de FONTENOY. Bellingham Family Dates Back to Wars of the Roses - The Suspension of the Bank of England

Sir Henry Bellingham, who has just been appointed by King George to be his lieutenant and custos rotularum for the County of Lond, bears a name that is well known on this side of the Atlantic, especially in the New England states, as a number of members of the house of Bellingham held office there in colonial days; one of them in particular, Richard Bellingham, having been Governor of Massachusetts throughout a considerable portion of the seventeenth century.

Morever, Sir Henry's eldest son, Edward Bellingham, who served throughout the war in South Africa as a subaltern of the Royal Scots Guards, now makes his home in New York.

It is a very old family, dating back to the wars of the Roses, and has been settled in Ireland since the reign of Queen Elizabeth. Among its distinguished members have been Sir Daniel Bellingham, who was mayor of Dublin and lord treasurer of Ireland in the reign of James I.; Col. Thomas Bellingham, who was the guide and A. D. C. of William III. at the battle of the Boyne, in consequence of which Castle Bellingham was torn down by the followers of James II. and Sir William Bellingham, who was the principal secretary of Prime Minister Pitt and one of the lords of the admiralty. It was he who received through Pitt the baronetcy now owned by the family.

Sir Henry himself is a former soldier, now a member of the bar, a chamberlain to the Pope, and a rich landowner, possessing some 10,000 acres in the best portion of County Lond. He has been twice married, and his present wife is a sister of Lord Grey de Ruthyn, the hereditary bearer of the gold spurs of the sovereign at the coronation. Lady Bellingham's other brother, Cecil Clifton, who is next heir to the ancient Barony of Grey de Ruthyn, makes his home in the United States and owns the Northfield ranch at Milner, in Montana.

Sir Henry Bellingham's first wife was a daughter of the second Earl of Gainsborough, and as such the granddaughter of King William IV. and the wife of the Marquis of Bute, immortalized in Romney's picture, "The Country Girl." One of Sir Henry Bellingham's daughters is married to the Marquis de Bute, while the other is a nun, for Sir Henry and his wife, in spite of the fact that they are the ancestors of Col. Thomas Bellingham, played at the battle of the Boyne, are devout Catholics.

A Visiting Countess. Countess Camilla Horov, who has just arrived in the states from England, is a frequent visitor to the United States, and has a number of friends here, especially in New York and up in the Berkshires, where, on the last occasion of her trip across the Atlantic, she was extensively entertained. She is the youngest daughter of the late Count George of Hohenlohe, the Austrian archduke of the empire, and the wife of the Marquis de Bute, a grandchild, therefore, of the late Emperor William I. She was born on the Isle of Wight, was brought up almost wholly in England, is a familiar figure in London society, is tall, handsome woman with blue eyes, and fluff golden hair, and was formerly engaged to Samuel Pepys Cockrell of the London foreign office, but broke off the engagement within a fortnight of the date appointed for the wedding. One of her sisters is the widow of Prince Herbert Bismarck, while another is the wife of Count Louis Plessen, German envoy at Athens.

The Horov family is of Spanish origin, and came from the Iberian peninsula to Germany in the train of Emperor Charles V. Indeed, the original house of Horov still flourishes in Spain, and for a number of years the Marquis of Hohenlohe, Spanish ambassador at the court of Vienna, the Horovs were created barons of the Holy Roman Empire in 1817, and counts one hundred years later, and now own great territorial possessions in Austria. One of the members of the house, Count Ladislav Horov, was for many years envoy of Emperor Francis Joseph at Washington, and assisting in the closing of a quarter of a century later served as secretary of the mission, which had meantime been raised to the rank of an embassy.

McNAMARA TRIAL GOES OVER UNTIL FRIDAY. Los Angeles, Cal., Oct. 11—James B. McNamara, of Cincinnati, was placed on trial for murder here today before Judge Bordwell, in the superior court. Clarence S. Darvon, chief counsel for the defendants, announced that he wished to sever the cases and immediately District Attorney John E. Frederick asked that James B. McNamara for trial. The prisoner is twenty-nine years old and unmarried.
