## ALL RED LINE COMPANY

Three Days And a Half Between Blacksod Bay, Ireland and Halifax is The Proposal-Incorporation at Ottawa

Ottawa, Ont., Feb. 22—A bill incorporating a proposed "All Red Line" from Great Britain to Halifax and from Vancouver to Australia and New Zealand passed the private bills committee of the house to day. The name chosen had been the All Red Steamship Company, but it was chang ed today to the Imperial Steamship Company has the former name by letters patent.

It was explained that the project is the establishment of a fast line of steamers between Blacksod Bay, Ireland, and Halifax, with a speed of 25 knots an hour. The Atlantic would be crossed in 3 1-2 days. Train ferrys between England and Sydney is proposed.
