

II. In reference to the request of the society at Killaloe, Bonnechere Mission, your committee recommends that the missionary on this charge be permitted to collect in the Ottawa Valley for the liquidation of the debt.

III. Whereas, a petition was presented to this Conference by the Chesley society, asking aid for liquidating their church debt, and, whereas that society has subscribed over \$700.00 to be collected on the Conference district and that the presiding elders appoint collectors on their respective districts.

IV. Whereas, Niagara Mission petitions this conference for an appropriation of \$70.00 annually for three years for the liquidation of their parsonage debt, resolved that this request be granted.

V. Whereas, a question of information was received from the Young People's Alliance respecting the payment of their missionary monies collected by them, therefore Resolved that we recommend that such monies be paid over to the local pastor who can pay them to the missionary treasurer. However, each local Alliance shall report the amount of such monies to the Conference branch treasurer. The Conference treasurer shall also report to the Conference branch treasurer of the Y. P. A.

VI. Whereas, the minutes of the Building Committee were referred to this committee for approval, therefore, Resolved, that we ratify the report of the parsonages of Stratford and Listowel Missions.

VII. Whereas, Bro. L. Wittig still has a claim of \$32.33 against Blenheim parsonage, therefore we recommend that this amount be paid him from the surplus of the Chesley church collecting fund.

The report was adopted.

The committee to nominate a Board of Examiners reported, which report was received.
