MOB ATTACKS SUFFRAGETTES. London, July 23.—A suffragette demonstration took place in Pinbury Park organized by Sylvia Pankhurst, the younger of the two daughters of Mrs. Emmeline Pankhurst, in a riot. Ten thousand persons surrounded the four platforms from which addresses were made. It was obvious from the outset that a majority of those in attendance were hostile.

The insistence of the women orators in continuing their speeches in defiance of the shouting and jeering and singing aroused the anger of the crowd and what was merely scuffling led to fighting.

The police were helpless at first, but were reinforced, but not in sufficient numbers. The people were thrown down in successive rushes and many women and children were rescued with difficulty from being trampled under the feet of the mob.

The speeches of the women could not be heard.
