

WILL REOPEN BIG NEWCASTLE QUARRY

**Fifty Men to be Employed
In Rosebank Freestone

less Station.**

Newcastle, Aug. 13.—The freestone quarry in Rosebank, just across the Dutch Fork, from Brook, from Newcastle, is to be reopened and will employ about 50 men. Charlotetown Cathedral, recently destroyed, was built of Rosebank stone and it is understood will be rebuilt of the same.

Surveys have been commenced this week on the land recently purchased by the Newcastle Syndicate for a wireless station.

The contract for the superstructure of the new Presbyterian Sunday school hall has been awarded to Councillor Peter Forsythe of Whitneyville.


