

NORTH SHORE MAN HAS NARROW ESCAPE FROM DROWNING

Loggville Man, a Cripple,
Found in River Near His
Home — Prompt Measures
Saved His Life.

Loggville, N. B., Aug. 3.—A shocking incident occurred here yesterday, when Mr. Alexander Campbell, a justice of the peace, was found in a drowning condition in the river near his home. In the absence of the town doctor, a Chatham doctor was called and his immediate arrival, coupled with his skill, proved successful, and Mr. Campbell is still living, and hopes of his recovery are now entertained. It is not known positively how Mr. Campbell got himself to the water, as he has been unable to move about without assistance, for about a year or more. Many years ago, as the result of an accident, he had to have one of his legs amputated. Some months ago his other leg began to trouble him, and for some time past he has been unable to move about much. He has recently been brooding much over his helplessness. His wife has been seriously ill for some time and the news of the proceedings came as a great shock to her. Mr. and Mrs. Campbell's many friends deeply sympathize with them in their afflictions.

SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH- WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

The sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years old, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion Lands in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Division Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be obtained at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not Sub-Agency), on certain conditions. Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within five miles of the homestead, or on a portion of it, at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. The homestead must be in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price \$4.00 per acre. Duties—Six months residence in each of three years after earning homestead patent also 60 acres; extra cultivation, Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain conditions. Settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$4.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate 60 acres and erect a house for \$500.
