**ARRESTED AS
PICKPOCKET
AT AGE 87**

Dean of Profession Does Not Smoke or Drink.

**HAS SPENT MANY
YEARS IN JAIL**

Was Operating on Fort Lee
Ferry When Spotted by
Officers of Law.

New York, July 6.—Harry Williams, 87 years old, known as the "dean of the pickpockets," was arrested at the Fort Lee ferry, charged with practicing the calling in which he is now a veteran of fifty-four years' standing.

Williams, who is well preserved, erect and steady of hand, had not been arrested before in 1921, although he served two terms of three months in the 1920. Detectives Coy and Long of the pickpocket squad were sent to the ferry after a number of complaints had been received from passengers who had lost purses, money and watches. The venerable Williams had not been suspected in a grandfatherly manner with some of his victims.

Detectives Saw Him.

The two detectives saw the light-fingered Nester make his way to the center of a group of persons leaving the ferry. Pretending to have difficulty in keeping his footing, the experienced old man bumped one of his neighbors after the other and clutched at them. As they emerged from the station they backed off the veteran.

"We saw you," he said.

"Well you needn't shout and attract a crowd," said Williams.

The old man then walked over and gave himself up, asking to get to jail as quickly as possible.

Spent Much Time in Jail.

Williams has spent a large proportion of his time in jail since 1887, and says that it is a healthful life. He has frequented New York jails principally in recent years, but he has been in jails in nearly every city of the country. For years he inhabited jails in the middle west for the most part, used to be in jail at Omaha and Kansas City. He has been in jail in southern jails. Williams is seldom in jail on the act of pick-pocketing and usually serves short sentences for loitering. According to the detectives, the older men's earnings capacity is not commensurate with age. He does not smoke or drink and a half century of training has made him a very good nerve control that his fingers when off duty are as motionless as marble.

Making her initial start on the circuit, Jeannette Rankin raced a woman and won the five thousand dollar "Pacing" for 1400 yards in today's feature of the horse racing at North Randall, Ohio, which is owned by George Dudley, of Youngstown, Ohio, and the event in two straight heats.

She was an overwhelming favorite for the betting.

The 2.06 pace went to Jeannette Rankin, and in the second heat, Quirk. After finishing third in her first heat, she captured the next day's feature, a \$5,000 "Pacing" for 1400 yards, when Broome's "Trotter" won. In the second heat, Jeannette's horse, was defeated in the 2.10 heat, which went to the Toddler in a straight heat. Broome Trotter sold for \$1000 dollars in a 1000 dollar and 1000 dollars auction pool.

It required four heats to decide the first division of the 2.26 pace, which was won by Jeannette Rankin in the second and fourth heats.
