Your Building and Church Improvement Committee, as appointed by you at a congregational meeting on the 3rd of February, 1886, met for the first time on the 9th of that month, thereby you see they lost no time in setting about the work given them to do by you.

The first thing done was the appointing of a Committee by the Sabbath School, consisting of Messrs Fraser, Brennen and Givin, to visit the Toronto Sabbath schools and prepare some plan to submit to the Building Committee. This deputation went to Toronto, and reported accordingly, through Mr. Brennen, at a later meeting. It was then decided to advertise for tenders. This was done, and Mr. Lucian Hills was appointed architect, and to him the tenders were addressed. Thirty-three tenders were received for the several patts of the work for the new S. S. Building.
