

All powers relating to the *Habeas Corpus* vested in the Court of King's Bench, at the passing of this Act to be vested in the Court of King's Bench and Common Pleas to be now erected.

XXIV. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that all powers and authorities vested by any former law in the several Courts of King's Bench in this Province, which existed at the passing of this Act, or in any or either of them, and related in any manner or way to His Majesty's writ of *Habeas Corpus* in Civil and criminal matters, or to the awarding or issuing, or return thereof, or to the hearing trying or determining in due course of law, of any question, or issue, or matter, or thing, thence arising, or incident thereunto, in any manner or way whatsoever, shall be, and the same, and each and every of them, is and are hereby vested in the Court of King's Bench, hereby constituted, and in the Court of Common or Civil Pleas hereby constituted, concurrently and in each and every of the Justices of the said last mentioned Courts of King's Bench, and Common or Civil Pleas, respectively.

Appeal from the said Court of Common Pleas to the K. B.

XXV. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that an appeal and writ of error shall lie from the judgment of the Court of Common or Civil Pleas, hereby constituted, to the Court of King's Bench, hereby constituted, in every case in which an appeal or writ of error lay, before the passing of this Act, from the judgments of the then existing Court of King's Bench, or either of them, to the Provincial Court of Appeals, and an appeal shall lie from the judgments of the Court of King's Bench hereby constituted, to His Majesty in his Privy Council, in every case, as well criminal as civil, in which an appeal lay to His Majesty in his Privy Council, from the judgment of the said Provincial Court of Appeals.

And from the said Court of King's Bench to his Majesty in Council.

All papers at present in the Courts of Appeal and in the Courts of King's Bench of Criminal jurisdiction to be transmitted to the said Court of King's Bench hereby established.

XXVI. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that all and every the Records, Papers, Registers and Judicial Proceedings thereto relating, of the said Provincial Court of Appeals, and of the several Courts of King's Bench existing in this Province, at the passing of this Act, in Criminal matters, shall be forthwith transmitted into, and make part of the Records of the Court of King's Bench, hereby constituted, and the said Court of King's Bench, hereby constituted, shall and may hear, try and determine, all such causes as shall be pending and remain unheard and undetermined in the said Provincial Court of Appeals, and all causes or Pleas of a Criminal nature, which shall be pending and remain unheard, and undetermined in the several Courts of King's Bench, existing in
